The California Association of Health Underwriters (CAHU) is pleased to SUPPORT your AB 1534, as amended June 26, 2017, that will protect patients with human immunodeficiency virus HIV from having to pay for specialist level co-pays, by adding HIV specialists as designated primary care providers (PCP) for health plans and policies issued, amended, or renewed on or after January 1, 2018.

According to the California Health Benefits Review Program's (CHBRP) carrier survey, most health plans and policies, including Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans and plans accessed through CalPERS, allow HIV specialists to act as PCPs if the HIV specialist meets the health plan's PCP requirements. However, the Aids Healthcare Foundation has reported that this is not always the case. AB 1534 will provide needed clarity and more cost effective care and access for those living with HIV.

Changing the PCP designation will make visits to these providers subject to less expensive regular office visit co-pays and will reduce administrative impediments, such as ordering tests or making additional referrals. CAHU believes AB 1534 will help patients living with HIV with improved continuity of care for a disease that was once acute but has become manageable today with chronic care.
