ASSEMBLY HEALTH COMMITTEE

Dear Assembly Member Gordon:

The California Association of Health Underwriters (CAHU) regrets we must **OPPOSE** your **AB 339**, as amended April 7, 2015, that unnecessarily raises costs for most health care consumers by mandating a cost shift from those that use high cost drugs to those that do not.

AB 339 mandates health plan contracts offered, renewed, or amended after January 1, 2016, and that provides coverage for outpatient prescription drugs, to provide coverage for medically necessary prescription drugs that do not have a therapeutic equivalent, and requires copayments, coinsurance, and other cost sharing for these drugs to be reasonable.

CAHU believes that **AB 339** will increase premiums for our clients and may interfere with the benefit design offerings of Covered California. Furthermore, the Affordable Care Act's out of pocket maximum are already in place to address the issue of high cost specialty drugs. AB 339's real world impact, if enacted, will be to ensure that costs for specialty drugs are shifted from out of pocket costs to premiums increases for all health care consumers.

Our members help millions of individual Californians and businesses evaluate, select, purchase and use their health care coverage plans, resulting in greater health and financial security.
